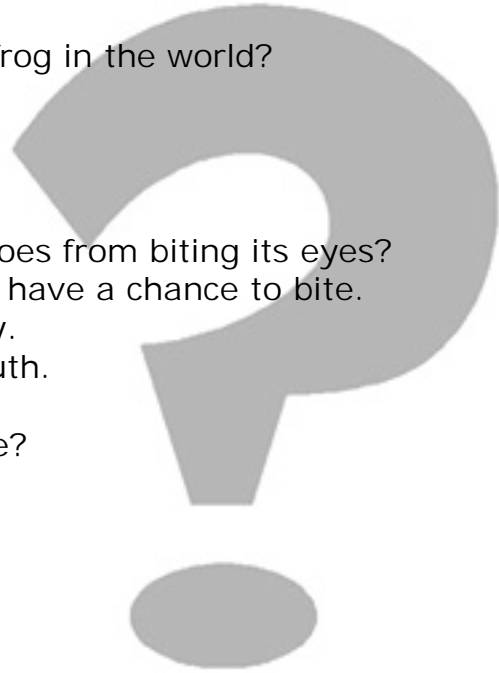


Frog Quiz 2

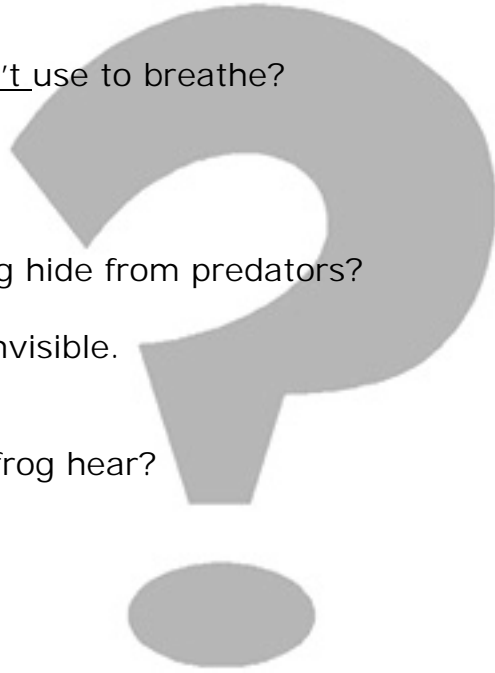


Frog Quiz 4
